

#### **GIFT DAY**

This year, we are holding Gift Day on two Sundays: 4<sup>th</sup> November and 18<sup>th</sup> November, either side of Remembrance Sunday.

The PCC have set a target of £15,000, which will be under the umbrella of Capital Projects and used for Phase 2 of our roof repairs. This is a different section of roof from the one we repaired in 2012 and is needed soon to protect the church from water ingress. The cost is not yet finalised, but will be considerable, bearing in mind that for Phase1 we had to raise £65,000 through the generosity of the parish.

An explanation of what has happened to the money raised on our last three Gift Days will be given in Church next Sunday.

Gift Day envelopes will be available in Church then and during the following couple of weeks and we ask that you take additional ones for neighbours and friends.

Please give your prayerful support to this appeal, which will enable us to continue God`s work at All Saints in a secure building. Thank you

"I don't read the Bible at home or anywhere else, but I like *Open the Book* because you can see the stories come to life" said Zac, aged 7. Maybe there's a hidden actor in us all from the

days when we 'borrowed' Mum's shoes and scarf and dressed up to present a short play for the family in the summer holidays!

Open the Book involves a small team between 4 to 8 storytellers who present a scripted Bible Story in primary schools using drama, props and costumes to bring the stories to life. You don't have to learn any lines: just act out the script as you read it together as a team, presenting a story in about 10 minutes.

Open the Book has many resources as a follow up for schools to use which are greatly valued by the hundreds of thousands of children hearing the Bible Stories regularly. Local schools would value a visit from such a Team whether twice a term or more often; around the UK, particularly in urban city areas, there are more schools requests for visits than Teams to go. ## A NEW JOYFUL EXPERIENCE! CONFIRMATION 2019

Don't you just like growing things! Whatever it is there's a real sense of achievement as you watch your project grow. At Harvest Stephen gave us a crocus to plant to watch it grow. The Apostle Paul felt much the same. He had planted a new church at Philippi but now as his life draws to a close he writes to them that he wants to "continue to help all of you grow and experience the joy of your faith" Philippians 1:25. Being part of a Confirmation Class, whether for the first time or to deepen your faith, will help you grow as a Christian; there is nothing static about a life of faith.
